• Sand Bypass Vs permanent solution

Fundamentally erosion prevention requires beach nourishment, several issues have been explored in the way works are carried out to ensure the least disruptive methods including routing vehicles around the town centre.

A detailed study of coastal processes is being conducted.

Volunteer to run tours of port without tying up full time staff

A process is being developed to have monthly tour options utilising volunteers to conduct tours for the public.

• Dust that is visible when loading wheat.

MWPA are working with CBH to look at ways to reduce the dust.

• Sponsorship requirements

A full review of the MWPA Sponsorship program has been conducted and the new program will be launched in the new financial year.

10. Questions on notice:

• Is it possible to load cattle at Broome and then ship then down to Geraldton? Yes with further feasibility to be conducted

• Is the port responsible for erosion at Drummond Cove? All modelling demonstrates that the Port is not responsible

- Are Visitors ID photo really necessary?
- Yes, Photo ID is a Marine Security requirement

• Will future Harbour development exasperate erosion north of port? Any changes may move point of effect, fundamentally no changes resulting from the Port are expected in the next 15 years.

There are nesting Osperys at the back of the Karara shed-refer this to Environment team The lights on fly over are not all lit, only about 40% work, needs to be referred to Main Roads MWPA will look into these matters and report back
